FOR OUR DANCERS

Welcome to Concord Dance Academy. The first step to becoming a successful dancer is making a solid commitment to your classes, rehearsals, and performances. Strong technique is a key ingredient and class is where you develop that technique. Come to each class prepared to learn and without personal distractions. Class time is your chance to focus on yourself, so try to leave your concerns or worries at the studio door. True progress is made when you look at each class, rehearsal, or performance as an opportunity to become better at what you love to do. Dance full out, stretch a little further, become more aware of your technique, and make the most of every class.

Respect for the teachers and choreographers you work with is essential. Listen to each correction given, whether it's directed to you or another dancer. A correction is an honor; it shows you how much a teacher cares about your progress as a dancer. Always say thank you when a teacher or choreographer offers you constructive criticism. Nothing can stop those students who apply themselves in every class and appreciate their teachers' knowledge and experience.

FOR THE PARENTS: "WE'RE IN THIS TOGETHER"

We believe that a child's success depends on the support of his/her parents or guardians. Because your commitment to the process makes an enormous difference, we encourage you to be a part of your child's dance education.

Our program relies on a positive atmosphere for our faculty, students, and their parents; it promotes a positive learning experience for all involved. Cooperation between all parents is expected. Showing respect for the other parents, along with the students and faculty, makes an important impression on the children. You are a role model for your child in how to interact with others in a professional setting.

Your child's presence at all classes, rehearsals, and performances is imperative. The spirit of teamwork and the lesson of dedication are a big part of our school's educational process.

Parents and teachers may look at a child's learning from different perspectives. However, they share a common goal: to assure that every child receives the best possible training, both physically and mentally. Mutual respect between our faculty and our dancers' parents provides the children with the ultimate care and education.

FOR DANCERS & PARENTS

Communication

Email is a major form of communication. It is imperative that we have your current email address and any changes to your email address that occur during the year. Please check your email DAILY! If you do not have email, or you are having problems with your computer, it is your responsibility to check with the office for updated information. Please add your child's email as well. If you are allowed to accept email at your work email address, include that as well.

Classes

Classes meet weekly beginning September 15th up until our last week of classes May 18th – 22nd (last day of Saturday classes is May 16th.) Our studio follows the Concord School District for vacations and weather closures. Attached to this packet is our current calendar of proposed closures for the year.

It is important to attend as many, if not all, classes for the year as we spend class time preparing for upcoming performances. Missed classes may cause a student to fall behind in choreography and cause undue stress while trying to catch up as well as delay learning for other class members.

If missing class is unavoidable, you must notify the office by email.

Rehearsal & Other Information

Rehearsals are an important part of the commitment to our school.

We use rehearsals as a time to prepare and give students a chance to become familiar with the stage before any of our performances.

It is imperative that students are at all rehearsals and shows at least 30 minutes before start time. This gives them the chance to settle in before it is their turn to perform.

We ask that all students wear their normal classroom attire (mentioned above) to rehearsals unless otherwise specified. All hair must be secured back from their face in a secure performance bun for rehearsals.

It is expected that all dancers will be always on their best behavior during rehearsals and work as team players.

Tuition & Expense Policy

All accounts must have a card on file in their Studio Director account and must be opted in to Auto pay. All monthly tuition payments will be auto withdrawn on the 1st of each month or must be paid in cash. Any payment received after the 1st of the month is subject to a \$30 or 10% of your balance late fee, whichever is greater.
